New Workday System Previewed at Customer Confirmation Sessions

The Iowa WorkSmart Project achieved an important milestone in August with a preview of Iowa's Workday Human Capital Management (HCM) system.

In a series of Customer Confirmation Sessions (CCS), members of the WorkSmart Project Team demonstrated features and functionality of HCM Core/Compensation, Time Tracking, Absence, Benefits, Payroll, and Travel Expense Reimbursement.

For agency representatives in attendance, this was a first glimpse of the Workday functionality and business processes which will transform HR operations and modernize State government. Feedback has been positive, and input received will help influence continued development in the configuration and prototype stage.



Change Agents, Change Network Ramping Up

A project as transformative as the WorkSmart Project requires a coordinated change management effort. To facilitate that effort, the WorkSmart Organizational Change Management (OCM) Readiness Team has been working with State agencies to identify Change Agents.

Change Agents will play an important role in the Project's statewide change network, serving as the WorkSmart primary point of contact for their organizations, sharing communications with appropriate audiences, assisting with internal change readiness activities, advocating for the project, and collecting/relaying feedback.

So far more than 100 Change Agents have been designated, and a kick-off meeting is scheduled for later this month. Working together, State of Iowa employees will play a role in the WorkSmart Project's success and shaping the future of our workplace. More to come!
